



Application Questions: The Wedge of The Gospel

1. Give an example of how you chose to view your circumstances in light of your theology this week.
2. How did you seek to know God this week? What effect did that have on you?
3. What does Acts 17:3 mean when it says "it was *necessary* for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead"?
4. Of the 5 methods of sharing the Gospel (proclaim, explain, prove, reason, persuade), which do you think Christians do best/worst? Which do *you* do best/worst?
5. With respect to #4, what are some ways you could broaden and improve your ability to share the Gospel?
6. Why is it important to actually persuade people to put their faith in Jesus Christ alone? Why is that difficult in our culture?
7. In what ways do you see people rejecting the Gospel today due to self-interest? How might this perspective enable you to share the Gospel differently (and possibly more effectively)?
8. What are some evidences in your life that you eagerly welcome the Scriptures' truth and influence?
9. What are some ways you systematically study the Bible? What are some ways you systematically study others' truth claims in light of the Bible?
10. With respect to #8-9, give an example of a strong opinion or conviction you've changed recently as a result of seeing that it didn't line up with God's Word.
11. What one thing would you like to see change in your life in response to this message? What's your first step in seeing God do that in/through you?
