Application Questions: Neither Murderer Nor God

1. What did you do this week in response to your understanding of what God is doing through your storms?
2. What are some ways God has protected you over the years?
3. What are some ways God has empowered you over the years?
4. What are some ways God has provided for you over the years?
5. What does seeing your answers to questions #2-4 do for you? What emotions do you feel? What thoughts do you have?
6. How does rehearsing your answers to questions #2-4 change your perspective on your circumstances right now?
7. What things do you think shape your perspective the most? [You always tend to view your present circumstances in light of what events, attitudes, convictions, or desires?]
8. What one thing about God (a character quality, an action, a promise, etc.) gives the most shape to your perspective? What does this theological truth do for you?
9. What one thing is your life about, more than anything else? What would those who know you best say about you?
10. With respect to question #9, how does this thing come to surface during storms/trials?
11. In your own words, what made Paul invincible? How would you get this kind of invincibility for your own life?
12. What one thing will you do with this message?
