Gospel Applications: Do You See Jesus?

- 6. How could the first disciples have all the evidence in the world and still miss the fact that Jesus had to die and rise from the dead? How do we make the same root error today?
- 7. How will you look for Jesus this week? Be specific!

- 2. Ask God to show you the rainbow-like display of Jesus' glory as you spend time in His Word, in Communion, and in meditating on his wounds.
