- 8. In your own words, what are some ways 2 Chronicles 7:14 "predicts, prepares for, reflects, or results from the person and/or work of Christ"?
- 9. What's the #1 thing you learned about this specific text?
- 10. What's the #1 thing you learned about how to properly study and understand the Bible in general?
- 11. What's one specific way you'll seek to change or grow in response to this message?
