## **Gospel Applications: Stand on The Promise**

- 1. What are some routine types/sources of waiting you encounter in everyday life?
- 2. What are some things you're waiting on/for right now?
- 3. Do you consider yourself a patient or impatient person? Why?
- 4. List some promises from the Bible that God has made to you ["you" meaning you are included in the groups of people those promises were first made to]:
  - What are a couple of your favorite promises? Why?
  - Which promise do you find it hardest to believe? Why?
- 5. Abram reacted with fear, manipulation, and cynicism when he doubted God's promises. Where do you see these reactions in your life? How else do you react when it doesn't seem like God's going to keep his promises quickly enough to help you? [Include thoughts, emotions/feelings, words, actions, etc.]
- 6. Review your answers to #5. How do these reveal a lack of trust in God?
- 7. In your own words, what does it mean to "stand on" God's promises? What are some practical ways to do that in everyday life?
- 8. Chose one favorite and one hard-to-believe promise from #4. If he see how each promise ultimately points to Jesus, how does that change your thinking?
- 9. Refer to the skyscraper illustration.
  - What, functionally is your **foundation**? [What are your hopes/dreams built on? What do you ultimately rely upon for safety and stability?]
  - What is your core? [What keeps your life from being shattered by every trial that comes along?]
  - What is your counterweight [What keeps pulling you back to center when life begins to bend under the strain of trials or waiting?]
