## **Gospel Applications: Stay on Mission**

- 1. What are some things you do as a follower of Jesus, or that we do as a church, that you have no idea whether it's essential or peripheral/optional to the practice of your faith? [Suggestion: On your own time, write out every spiritual practice you have, whether personal/private or corporate/public. Then make a list of essential Christian practices and another list of cultural preferences.]
- 2. What is the essence of your functional <u>hope</u>? Who or what do you look to moment-by-moment to see whether things are going to be okay or not?
- 3. What is the essence of your functional <u>mission</u>? If you can only do one thing with your life, what are you striving for?
- 4. What are some ways your hopes and mission have been impacted over the past few months of COVID-19, stay-at-home orders, and now racial tensions?
- 5. How would you describe the difference between your mission and vocation? In your life, which serves the other? (Give examples of how you can tell.)
- 6. What are some ways you've adapted the means/methods of your life in order to stay on mission over the past couple months? How much time and intentional thought have you given to strategic changes to stay on Jesus' mission? What changes have you made?
- 7. What are some ways you could adapt what it looks like to follow Jesus in order to be *more* faithful to him and his mission in these changing times?
- 8. What are some ways Grace City could adapt what it looks like to follow Jesus in order to be *more* faithful to him and his mission in these changing times? Does this question make you aware of any "sacred cows" in your thinking? (Things that are not essential to Scripture or our mission, but essential to you.) [Please share you suggestions and conclusions!]
- 9. In light of this message, what are you most excited about in terms of living on Jesus' mission together over the next 3, 6, and 12 months? What are you most excited about the potential of, as we give ourselves and each other permission to try new things?
- 10. What one thing will you do with this message this week?
