Questions for Gospel Reflection & Application

- 1. What's the first thing you think when you hear the word "mystery"? What do you picture when you think of a hidden treasure?
- 2. Why do you think cultures ancient and modern place such a premium on secret or esoteric knowledge so-called "keys to success"?
- 3. What are some of the things our culture treasures most?
- 4. Pick a couple answers from #3:
 - What "riches" do these things seem to promise people?
 - What are people willing to sacrifice to get these things?
 - What reality do these things actually deliver in the short term?
 - What hope do these things ultimately hold for the future?
- 5. If the word of God is "fully known" (1:25), what is it that you've come to know? How does this change the way you approach reading/studying the Bible?
- 6. Practically, how could you study the Bible to know Christ more personally and not just academically? How can you gain experiential/relational wisdom concerning Christ and not just bare knowledge of facts?
- 7. What do you functionally treat *as if* it were the key to wisdom and knowledge, the source of the good life? How does this play out in everyday life? What would it look like to pursue Christ in place of this other thing?
- 8. What one thing will you do to act on this message?
