# **Questions for Gospel Reflection & Application**

- 1. Review: Share one way you approached your work/vocation differently this week as a result of last week's message? How did you live as an apprentice to Jesus? How did you act as an ambassador of Jesus?
- 2. What is the default strength of your life (meaning: if you don't stop and think about it, what power/wisdom/resource will you functionally rely on)?
- 3. When are you most self-reliant? When are you most God-dependent? Why in those circumstances? What do you observe about yourself?
- 4. Think about a time when you wanted God to do something sensational to prove his power. What did you want him to do? Why that? Why do you think we associate God's power with the extraordinary > the ordinary?
- 5. Skim John 14:12-31 and 16:7-15. What are some things Jesus said the Spirit would do when he comes? Which of these do you sense your need for right now and how would this empower you if the Spirit did this in your life?
- 6. If the Spirit's power is already present in your life as a believer, what are some ways you would access it? What are some things that might hinder your access to his power?
- 7. Pick a day this week and choose to pray and ask God for his power many times throughout the day, whether you feel the need for it right that moment or not. After you've done this for at least one day, what did you observe?
- 8. What kingdom thing are you pursuing right now that is far beyond your own resources and strength? What would happen if God simply didn't show up in this situation? What are some potential outcomes if God's power is manifested?
- 9. Why do you want God's power? Be honest: is it about using God simply to get or achieve something you want, or is it about making more of Jesus? Think about your motives in asking for God's power and record your thoughts.
- 10. What one practical thing will you do with this message this week?
