Questions for Gospel Reflection & Application

- 1. Generally speaking, a kingdom is "a realm or region in which something is dominant; an area or sphere in which one holds a preeminent position" (*Merriam Webster Dictionary*). Given this definition . . .
 - What are some of the "kingdoms" of this world, specifically of our culture?
 - How did these "kingdoms" come to be in the first place?
 - How did they grow in influence/power/control?
 - What causes them to shrink in influence/power/control?
 - Compare/contrast your answers with what you know to be true of the kingdom of God.
- 2. Reflect on your own feelings and thoughts right now. What, if anything, grieves or confuses you? What are some healthy ways to appreciate and process these emotions in light of the Gospel?
- 3. How does Jesus' analogy of the seed help you understand the need for personal self-forgetfulness and sacrifice?
- 4. What excites you most about Jesus' analogy of the seed?
- 5. What are some things in your life that you need to die to (let go of, refuse to seek your identity/significance in)? What would it look like to die to these?
- 6. Why do you suppose God delights to work synergistically through His church?
- 7. How does the "automatic" power and growth of the seed humble you? How does it encourage you? Why do we need to remember both parts of this?
- 8. What's one practical way you'll respond to the message this week?
