Questions for Gospel Reflection & Application

- 1. Review: Share a situation from this past week where you deliberately thought about both your passion and your compassion. How did that change your experience of that situation?
- 2. What do you think/envision when you hear the words "kingdom of God"?
- 3. As a Christian, you are a part of an "outpost" of the kingdom of God. How does this help you think about what it means to be a Christian . . .
 - In terms of your identity?
 - In terms of your priorities?
 - In terms of your role and responsibilities?
- 4. What are some ways Jesus did not live up to people's expectations of what a Messiah should be like?
- 5. With reference to #4, what are some ways the reality of Jesus' reign as King of kings is better than what people expected?
- 6. Why do you think there are so many paradoxes wrapped up in the person and work of Jesus, all the way from birth to death? What are some things you learn from these seeming contradictions and oddities?
- 7. In the sermon, we talked about two returns of King Jesus: the return from the grave and the future return at the end of time. Obviously the first return had to happen in order for the second to happen, but why is the first return important theologically? How does it legitimize what Jesus will do in his final return?
- 8. Who/what gets your functional allegiance? What are you most loyal to without even thinking about it? List some ways that loyalty expresses itself in daily life.
- 9. What would you say are your top 3 priorities right now? Compare/contrast those with what you think are probably the top 3 priorities of King Jesus.
- 10. What's one practical thing you'll do this week to deliberately build your life around and reflect King Jesus?
